Happy New Year! With the bitter cold snap it is clear that we are nearing the full **Wolf Moon**, on **January 15**, at **11:52 p.m. EST:** The name derives from a time amid zero degree cold and the deep snows of midwinter, when the wolf packs howled hungrily outside Algonquin Indian villages. It was also known as the Old Moon, the Moon after Yule, or in some tribes the Full Snow Moon, although most applied that name to the February moon. The moon is at apogee - its farthest point from Earth, making it the *smallest full moon* of 2014. In terms of apparent size, it will appear 12.2-percent smaller than the full moon of Aug.10, the biggest full moon of the year.

← ← The VGCA had a good year and in accordance with our mission to promote education, gun collecting and shooting of firearms, a number of presentation were made to organizations which support those initiatives. VGCA President Dave Litchfield presented a donation from VGCA of \$1000 to the NRA National Firearms Museum. The donation was accepted by

museum Director **Jim Supica**, who provided an overview of the new *National Sporting Arms Museum* recently

opened in Springfield, Missouri. Bass Pro Shops donated the space and time and NRA arranged for the guns, research and background material. VGCA also donated \$500 to the NRA Foundation for their work with grants and education programs of the NRA. **Melissa E. Coder** and **Christopher DeWitt** from the Foundation were present to accept the check. To support youth shooting, the VGCA made the following donations: \$225 went to the 4-H Youth Shooting Club *Trigger Time* for .22LR target ammunition. **Lee Turner** accepted the donation for the group. VGCA Gun Show Manager, **Rick Nahas** also donated a set of Ruger Mark II target pistols to the group for starting their silhouette shooting program. VGCA donated \$1395 to the Belvoir Bullets JROTC Shooting team to purchase an air rifle target system by Creedmoor Sports.

2014 Election of Officers Cycle: During the December annual meeting we opened the floor for nominations to fill the full 2014-2015 terms of the Association Officers. Currently, we have five (5) nominees for the 4 Officer positions. His arms will live long and will continue to be used the world over for good and not so good causes. We will maintain contact with his daughter Elena and perhaps be able to have her be a guest at one of our meetings in the future. Addison is hard at work preparing his Kalashnikov extravaganza presentation scheduled for this Fall.

We will start 2014 off with a super speaker for the January 23 Meeting, as NRA Museum Senior Curator Doug Wicklund will present on the new NRA National Sporting Arms Museum in Springfield, Missouri, and then lead us on a guided tour of the Robert T. Petersen Collection inside the National Firearms Museum. Don't miss this excellent opportunity to see these beautiful guns and hear the personal comments by Doug. This will be our second visit to the Petersen Collection and you can't get enough of this spectacular collection of 400 of the rarest guns on earth.

We are in the final stages of planning for the March Gun Show and we are down to about 8 open tables at this point. We have signed up some great new table holders including a local reloading business that will have bullets and powder at the show.

We will receive a brief by Kelly Cook on the plans for our 2014 Members Recognition Dinner scheduled for 5 April. This year the plan is to honor all the volunteers who helped VGCA last year, and Kelly will provide the details. Please continue to recruit qualified high caliber members for VGCA and make your plans for coming to the Gun Show and Members Dinner.

Show & Tell for the December 5th **Meeting:** There was a full schedule for the December Show and Tell. **Richard Pripeton** started the session by providing the group with a briefing on the new laptop computer VGCA purchased. This will be used for meeting presentations, to create membership ID Badges, and for administrative tasks at the VGCA Gun Shows. Richard provided the technical expertise to ensure we bought a machine that would fill all the criteria and arranged to have a complete software package to allow it to be used for many or the club tasks and also at events. Onward to more traditional items, **Member 1** showed a British War Office Pattern 1906 Training Rifle in .22RF. These rifles were made by a number of manufacturers including Birmingham Small Arms (BSA) and LSA. Due to heavy use and sales over the years, nice examples of this pattern trainer are becoming scarce. **Member 2** showed a SVW Walther P-38 pistol known as the "Gray Ghost" due to its distinctive finish. These pistols were assembled from existing parts after the war by the French occupation. It has pressed steel ribbed grips and French "star" proofs. Many went to French police and to French Indochina. **Member 3**

displayed a pre-war Winchester Model 60 in 7x57 Mauser chambering. It was originally outfitted with Lyman 48 sights and a Stith scope, but now has a Leupold 2-7x32 scope and mounts. This was a very nice classic. A Remington 51 pistol in .32 ACP was shown by **Member 4**. Designed by John Pederson (Pederson Device), over 65,000 were made between 1918 and 1927. Parts remained available until well into the 1930s. **Member 5** brought in a Hammerli Master CO2 target pistol in .177. The vintage piece still holds pressure and is very accurate. **Member 6** showed some very nice Walther pistols. The first was a pre-war PPK in extremely good condition with "Crown N" proofs, a matching Holster and spare magazine. It was chambered in 7.65 Browning and was for the commercial market. The second pistol was also a PPK made in 1935 with the distinctive 90 degree safety, and the third pistol was a 1939 commercial Walther PP, one of the last before military production took over. **Member 7** displayed his Davide Pedersoli reproduction of the British Brown Bess Short Land Pattern flintlock smoothbore musket. The original would have been among the weapons used by the British and loyalist colonial militias during the Revolutionary war. While bored to .75 caliber, it actually fired a .69 caliber ball from a paper cartridge containing 145 grains of black powder. **Member 8** presented his Russian Mosin-Nagant Model 91/30 Sniper Rifle. Definitely a piece which if it could talk would have some history; it was a true sniper in original finish and not a modern build up for the surplus market.

Mikhail Kalashnikov, father of the AK-47, dies: Lt. Gen. Mikhail T. Kalashnikov, the arms designer credited by



the Soviet Union with creating the AK-47, the first in a series of rifles and machine guns that would indelibly associate his name with modern war and become the most abundant firearms ever made, died on Monday, December 23, 2013 in Izhevsk. He was 94.

Born a peasant on November 10, 1919, General Kalashnikov had little formal education, but his role in the rifle's creation, and the attention showered on him by the Kremlin's propaganda machine, carried him from conscription in the Red Army to senior positions in the Soviet arms-manufacturing bureaucracy and ultimately to six terms on the Supreme Soviet, the Soviet Union's legislative body.

With tens of millions of rifles produced around the world, the Kalashnikov family of arms is the most common and recognizable military weapon ever made. To his critics, he said that the rifle was designed to protect his motherland, not to be used by terrorists or thugs. "This is a weapon of defense," he said. "It is not a weapon for offense."

He was married twice, the second time to Ekaterina Kalashnikova, a technician in his design bureau. He is survived by a son from his first marriage, Viktor Kalashnikov, who is also an arms designer; a daughter from his second marriage, Elena Krasnovskaya; a stepdaughter, Nelya; and several grandchildren.
