


Presentation at the April 26th Meeting: The speaker at the meeting was Mr. Jeff Brooks, Army PEO Ammo. He is the Program Executive Officer Ammunition, a Senior Executive Service position that directs all Army and joint service ammo acquisition programs. Mr. Brooks started off with a short bio and proceeded to show where his operation, which is tasked with developing projects for production and adoption by the military, fits in the overall Department of Defense and within the Ammunition Enterprise. His area of oversight includes small arms ammunition, all .30 caliber ammunition, tank ammo and 155mm artillery rounds. It also includes mortar rounds, and the new software that is increasingly integrated into munitions in the form of 'smart' rounds, bombs (the Army buys for all the branches of the Service), non-lethal man-portable air-defense systems (MANPADS), and non-standard ammo such as foreign rounds for Iraqi personnel. They also buy robots and explosive ordnance disposal items, and also procure, field, maintain, and replenish stocks of the products under their purview. He then addressed one of the largest aspects of his program,

the "Modernization" program. He described the modernization of 155mm rounds into 'smart' rounds designed to increase accuracy and minimize collateral damage. As an example, mines are no longer 'place and forget,' but are all remotely attended to maximize effects on a target, but minimize non-target injuries. He them covered the modernization of the current M855 5.56mm NATO U.S. military round into the new M855A1 round. This round dramatically improves performance on hard targets, soft targets, and range over the current round. In addition, it has reduced flash and the projectile is totally lead-free. Unfortunately, in response to a question from the audience that many were going to ask, there are no plans to make the round or components available to the civilian market. A question and answer period followed and capped off what was a very informative and fascinating presentation, and a great look into the development cycles and improvement of small arms (and some larger arms) ammunition. At the conclusion, Dave Litchfield presented Mr. Brooks with the VGCA speaker's gift.

★★ Special Notice - Request for Interested Members to Serve as Director of the VGCA: The election of Dave Litchfield as President of the VGCA has left his position on the Board of Directors vacant. According to the Bylaws of the Association, a vacancy due to the departure of a Director may be filled by a majority vote of the remaining Officers and Directors. If you are interested, or know someone who would be interested, please let one of the Officers or Directors know prior to or at the next meeting on May 24th, 2012. Interest will also be solicited from

the floor at the meeting. The current Officers and Directors will convene soon after the meeting and select the new Director from the list of those interested. We have a lot of activities in progress and a lot of ideas for the near future, so this is an important appointment, and we welcome interest.


New Members: Membership Chair **Larry Hare** presented Applications for Membership in the VGCA from **Forrest "Rick" Lindsay** (he goes by Rick and will be our May speaker), sponsored by Dave Litchfield, and **Louis Holt**, a life member of the NRA and the Single Action Shooting Society. Mr. Holt was sponsored by Jim Burgess and Addison Hurst. After introductions and self introductions, the two were voted into the Association. Welcome aboard.

Show & Tell for the April 26th Meeting: The evening started with member one displaying and asking for information on a family heirloom Civil War revolver from his family in Missouri. It was identified as a Colt Model 1860 Army, and was in very good shape. In keeping with the evening's presentation on ammunition, a second member showed an inert 25mm automatic cannon round and a small linked set of 20mm steel cased cannon rounds. Due to the steel cases, the chamber of the gun is fluted to assist in the extraction of the fired casing. A third member showed a rare bayonet from the Model or 1815 U.S. rifle. A fourth member displayed a US Springfield Rifle Model of 1888 Trapdoor in .45-70 with unit markings. He purchased this rifle at the Timonium show after getting expert advice and assessments by two Association members who collect the Trapdoor rifles. A fifth member displayed a very large 30 pound bar shot from Morris Heights, NJ. This type of shot was used to destroy the rigging and masts of sailing vessels. Of interest, was metallurgical testing of the components of the piece revealed the half-hemisphere ends of the shot were cast iron, but the bar connecting the two end pieces was wrought iron for strength and durability. The sixth and final piece was an RWS Diana Model 54 Air King air rifle in .177. This powerful and accurate air rifle uses a sliding action, previously used on low powered match air rifles to negate the felt recoil to the shooter. The recoil effect on a scope mounted to the action is not reduced and these powerful spring airguns can be very hard on scopes.
