

May 2016 VGCA Newsletter



OVGCA Meeting of April 28, 2016: This month we were treated to a very special guest in the form of Richard Jones, Editor for Janes Small Arms and former Director of the UK Pattern Room. He presented a fabulous series on Soviet Arms development since 1945 going into detail on weapons ranging from pistols to light machine guns to sniper rifles to special purpose firearms. Some of the pistols discussed included the PMM, the Nagant, the PSM, and the SR-1. Along with a discussion of these pistols their use and effectiveness on types of body armor as well as change in bullet design as well as barrel fluting were covered in detail. As we moved on into SMGs Richard was able to go into detail about 8 of these. The SR2MP and the PP90M stood

out among them for their odd stocks and designs. The PP-90M in particular could be folded up into a compact box that just looked like a standard piece of military gear rather than a weapon. The presentation then moved on to battle rifles and the AKs which are not called AK-47s in Russian but Avtomat Kalashnikova.

There are many variations on the weapons within the Kalashnikov family such as the stamped AK, the machined AK, AKS, AKM, and the AKMS. Further on top of those there is the AK-74 and its variants including the altered bullet it fires post 1991 with a mild steel core reshaped to better defeat hard ballistic plates. We also got into next gen rifles such as the AEK-971 and the AK-12 as well as the AK-100, the AN-94, and some more outside the box options. These included the AM Vikr and the AS Val. However moving on from Standard Rifles we entered Light Machine guns where the largest focus is reducing the soldiers weight burden. The Russians have beautifully done this with the PKM which ends up weighing roughly 60% of the US M240.



The final area of focus was Heavy Machine Guns and Special Purpose Firearms. One of the best examples of these is the Kord which weighing nearly 3 times the weight of a M240 does not care one bit about the soldiers weight burden and is a veritable powerhouse. Going to the exact opposite end of the spectrum we find the PMM silent pistol which uses self-contained projectile, cartridge and piston setup to fire a round quietly enough no one would associate it with a weapon discharging. In addition, the weapon only weighs in around 2 lbs. Another silent option is the S4M pistol though here we also entered into underwater pistols and rifles. These were the SPP-1, the APP-1M and the ADS.

All in all Richard gave us as spectacular overview of many Russian weapons throughout the years and how they have changed, developed, and improved. His presentation was eloquently wrapped up with a single photo showing our clubs fine tradition of connection to historians and the history of firearms. Simply put a photo of him and many of our own members with General Kalashnikov on a trip to Russia.

- ♦ April Business: The business meeting this month began with Jim Burgess leading the pledge of allegiance. Shannon Zeigler then gave us an outstanding financial update on how the gun show went as well as the status of the clubs finances overall. Rick Nahas then gave a report on the show which was largely a success with no incidents and a good renewal rate. We still need more table holders for the next show and you can reach out to Rick for that. Larry Hare than introduced then welcomed two new members to our club, Paul K. Kadowaki, sponsored by Dave Litchfield and Robert Bennett, sponsored by Larry Hare. The business meeting then proceeded into nominations for the upcoming election which is detailed below.


Other News!

- **2016 VGCA Officers Election:** This election marks our first since the new bylaws have been passed. The executive committee has voted to implement an electronic voting system for those members who receive the newsletter via email. The candidates running are Ernie Lyles for President, Richard Pripeton and Rick Nahas for Vice-President, Robin "Rob" Becker for Secretary, and Shannon Zeigler for Treasurer. As the close date for the election was May 19th I can happily report we increased voting to nearly 50% of those who received e-ballots nearly doubling election response.
