

Presentation at the June 28th Meeting: Our Speaker was VGCA Member Bill York, who covered some of the *Polish Radom Pistols* in his newly published book on these fine small arms. To enhance the discussion, Bill extended an invitation (June Newsletter) to the membership to bring in for discussion and the evening's Show and Tell, any examples of small arms of World War I, specifically with an emphasis on Nagant type revolvers, Ruby pistols, and other German, French, Austrian, Russian, and other small caliber pistols or revolvers used during that time period by Poland. He started with a brief history of modern Poland and their domestic and imported arms industries. He focused specifically on Poland's weapon situation following WWI, with an emphasis on pistols. After the war Poland acquired lots of armaments and pistols from the former Austro-Hungarian Empire, Russia, France, Germany, and others. This segment was amply augmented by his showing key point on the various sample pistols that he brought as well as some of the other handguns provided by members in attendance. He moved on to cover in detail, with fine examples, of the M1935 VIS Radom pistol. After the German occupation, these pistols continued to be manufactured by and marked Radom, but without the Polish crest, and were considered a highly desirable arm. He also touched upon the Polish Wz-35.22 Training Rifle bought in by a member for the evening's Show and Tell. Bill also added that the arms manufacturers using the Radom markings are considering using modern computer controlled CNC machinery to bring the

M1935 VIS Radom back to the market for a new generation of fans. The presentation was followed by a question and answer period with the audience. This was a great presentation and we thank Bill York for his expertise, his sharing parts of his collection, and for making the long trip from New England.

- **♦ Upcoming for August 23**rd **Meeting: Jim Burgess** will cover *Civil War Rifles*. If you have seen one of Jim's prior sessions you can be assured this will be interesting, informative and packed with historical references, as well as examples of the rifles. This is not to be missed.
- ♦ VGCA will also be hosting Jim Supica, Director of the NRA National Firearms Museum, to present him with a \$1000 donation from the VGCA to support the Museum and its educational mission. Notes from the Podium – President's Message: Summer is upon us and 2012 is continuing to be a banner year for the VGCA. On Saturday, June 16, 15 Members traveled to Lexington, VA for our long planned trip to the Virginia Military Institute (VMI). At VMI we were treated to a superb visit to the Stewart Collection of rare 18th and 19th Century firearms.

The collection includes 32 Colt Paterson revolvers, some cased with all the accessories! There are French, British, German, American, Russian, Chinese, etc., guns of the most interesting kind. Included is a beautifully engraved Walther PP made for General George S. Patton after his troops captured the original Walther factory in 1945. We were taken back into the secure archives where hundreds of guns not on display were available for us to see. A large collection of flags, including Civil War Battle Flags is also stored in the archives. The collection also includes a large assortment of early air rifles, including one like Lewis and Clark carried on their journey.

After lunch we toured the George C. Marshall Museum and received a super in-depth briefing on Marshall's career, his work during WWI and WWII, and his tour as Secretary of State. We saw original battle maps of the Normandy Invasion, carried ashore for immediate use in the first days of fighting. We were shown original studio photographs and original correspondence between Marshall and Patton.

Lastly we toured the new \$3.5M indoor shooting range at VMI. This is a very impressive facility. The range can accommodate every caliber up to the .50 caliber BMG.

All in all it was a tremendous trip and we all owe a big *Thank You!* to Addison Hurst, Joe Roberts, Sonny Line and King Von Schilling for their good work in setting up and executing the visit. Jack Looney took lots of photos, so everyone should be able to enjoy what we saw.

Our next trip will be this fall, when we visit Springfield Armory and Smith & Wesson in Massachusetts, and the Colt facility in Hartford, Connecticut. Rick Nahas and Bill York are coordinating this trip so get your name on their list.

Show & Tell for the June 28th Meeting: Show and Tell started with Member 1 showing an Arsenal SGL-21 in 7.62x39 made by Legion, Ltd. and Izhmash in Izhevsk, Russia. The rifle is converted from Saiga rifles with Russian receivers and chrome-lined hammer-forged barrels into the AK-103 "Century Series" format. Member 2 showed a dummy long rod penetrating round with discarding sabot used as an anti-tank round. This experimental round was powered by electrical energy and propellant to create a plasma generator that provided for very high velocity. The actual prototype gun used to fire the round used a large 10-shot revolving cylinder for rapid firing. The next item, discussed by Bill York in his presentation and later shown by Member 3 was a Radom Polish Wz-35 .22RF Training Rifle. This uncommon rifle followed a general Mauser design in appearance, but the bolt and action looked more like a Mosin Nagant in appearance. This same bolt and action design was later used in the post-WW2 Wz-48 trainers that were used as a trainer for the Polish Mosin Nagant Type 44 carbines used by the Communist government. Member 4 showed an interesting British-made automatic air rifle target box with a rotating target. It was powered by a European 220 volt motor and came with a 110 volt inverter to convert the motor to US current. They used to be sold in the back pages of *Popular Mechanics* magazine. Member 5 displayed a very unusual antique US-made needle-fire sporting rifle. Approximately 38 caliber, the rifle was marked with and 1849 Patent and G.P. Foster, Taunton, Massachusetts. The breech was marked Klein's Patent, 1849. The night closed with **Member 6**'s LC-14B military knife in complete, great condition. This knife was more commonly known as the civilian "Woodsman's Pal," and is still in production as a survival tool. The piece was accompanied by an original military pictorial manual of use, the scabbard, survival fish hooks and line, and a lens for starting fires.

A Gentle Reminder: We received some emails and requests to remind all attendees at the meetings that all firearms on display at the meeting, as well as those shown at the Show and Tell Sessions should be tied using the provided plastic ties and that anyone handling the pieces should be mindful of the muzzles even when tied. Additionally, to prevent inadvertent damage to rare or expensive pieces, the guns being displayed should not be handled without the owners' permission. Thanks.


