

Presentation from the October 25th Meeting: Lt.Col. Bernie Breighner, USAF Ret., and a collector of Class III, Sniper Rifles, and other weapons, covered the Mk11 Mod 0 Sniper Rifle based on the Knight's SR-25. Bernie started with a brief overview of the original AR10 in 7.62x51 NATO that was developed by Eugene Stoner at Fairchild/Armalite in the 1950's. While it lost out to the Springfield M14 as

the US main battle rifle, it was sold to the Netherlands and some African countries. He showed a number of illustrations of the original AR10 variants. The Knights SR-25 is based upon much of the Stoner design and included updates for reliability and durability, as well as suppressor compatibility features and mission specific improvements. It was designed to be a long range, highly accurate semi-automatic rifle that from day one was to accept a suppressor with a predictable and repeatable point of impact so that removing and then replacing the suppressor would not change the POI. The original SR-25/Mk11 Mod 0 Sniper Rifle utilized a 24" Remington 5R barrel with a 1-11.25" twist. To ensure repeatability, all the components – upper, lower, and suppressor were made by Knights and numbered to the rifle. Improvements to a second variant included reducing the barrel to 20" with no loss of accuracy and decreased weight. The U.S. navy version used a free-float rail system fore end and used a "Boots" Obermeyer barrel optimized for the M118LR round. The suppressor achieves a 30db sound reduction (about the equivalent of a car door closing.) Bernie had many accessories and the original manual as well many photos of the rifle in use. Knights has sold version to a number of countries including Australia and Israel. The Mk11 Mod 0 Sniper Rifle has been superseded by the new M110 Sniper Weapons System (M110 SWS) in 2007.

Notes from the Podium - President's Message

We have had an active and interesting October and November within the VGCA. Rick Nahas and I drove down to Anniston, Alabama on 9 October and shopped for rifles at the Civilian Marksmanship Program outlet store. The store stocks M-1 rifles in various grades and cost categories from cheap shooters to very expensive rare rifles and sniper versions. The inventory varies between all 4 of the manufacturers: Springfield Armory, Winchester, Harrington & Richardson and International Harvester and all the various grades that CMP offers for sale.

The outlet also offers .22 target rifles, drill and parade rifles returned from veteran organizations and college ROTC programs all over the US, bayonets, surplus and new ammunition, slings, and other military accessories, depending on what has been received, processed and released for sale. You can go to the CMP website to review how to qualify to buy guns from them, mail order applications for purchase, and current inventory for sale. The staff is extremely customer friendly and the process works like a Swiss watch from entry to selection, approval, payment and departure. There are plenty of technical experts to educate and assist you in selecting a rifle.

It is best to arrive on Wednesday morning before the store opens, so you can get in line for entry at opening time, and catch the new inventory for the week on display. If you wait for Thursday, you'll only have the left overs to choose from.

After our visit to the CMP store, Rick and I proceeded to drive north into Kentucky and make our way to the Knob Creek Shooting Range to join up with John Morris and Ed Costello for the big Fall machine gun shooting weekend. The weekend is a combination massive Class 3 shooting event and large gun/ammo/militaria sales show. We helped man John's sales tables and enjoyed our time under his rock hard management. John allows no lollygagging by his sales staff and took pride in critiquing every sale each one of us made for three days. John is an excellent judge of prospective customers and proved to be a great instructor to us. To his credit we had a fine time and he took good care of his staff.

On October 22, Rick and I led a delegation from Northern Virginia, including Jim Frigiola, Mike Goldschmidt, John Courtright and Harry Rensell up to Springfield, Massachusetts to visit the Smith & Wesson firearms production facility and the Springfield Armory National Historic (SANH) site. Dr. Jack Ganson joined us on location. Bill York brought in 7 members of the Ye Olde Connecticut Gun Guild who proved to be great additions to our group. These two tours were very interesting, each in a different way. The S&W tour allowed us to stand within inches of men and women making S&W products in all stages from the huge stamping machines banging out frames from steel round stock, to final boxing of Thompson Center and S&W M&P 15 rifles. We were picking up parts, asking questions and trying to figure out how to get a free sample out of the plant.

The SANH site is a walk back into the history of US government arms manufacturing from 1795 to 1967, with original production equipment, plans, photos and a large selection of historic weapons, including many M-1 rifles.

Finally, we successfully executed our Fall 2012 VGCA Gun Show at the PWC Fairgrounds on November 3-4. We had strong attendance numbers, and combined with our Spring 2012 Show, produced our best financial gain for a number of years. I want to give a very large THANK YOU to **Rick Nahas**, **Dennis Gerdovich**, and **Emory Hackman** of the Show Committee, to **Addison Hurst** and **Jim Burgess** for operating the Evaluation Table, to **Jim Burgess** for leading the judging of the Historical Displays, and to **John Frietsch** and the many set up and security volunteers all of whom made the show a success. Our next meeting, set for Thursday, December 13, will be the Annual Meeting and include a Pot Luck Holiday Dinner where we ask all attendees to bring a finger food, vegetable, salad, or desert dish to share. We will have an expanded Show & Tell and a SWAP Meet, so bring in your personal hardware and assorted items that night. (Please see announcement on Page 1. Editor)

* * * 2012 Fall VGCA Gun Show * * *

The Historical and Educational Display Awards for the 2012 Fall Gun Show were again outstanding. They covered firearms innovation, military historical and technological development, and in one case reflected recent current events and sacrifices made by our troops in Iraq and Afghanistan. Congratulations and thanks to all who presented displays that exemplify one of the core tenets of the VGCA – advancing the knowledge of firearms, history and the hobby of gun collecting.

- 1st Place Award: The award went to Bernie Breighner for his great display of *The Knight's SR-25 Mk11 Mod 0 Sniper Rifles*. These rifles are used with great success by the US Special Operations Command, the US Army, Navy, and Marines in locations like Afghanistan and Iraq. Designed for use with a matched suppressor, this display had some of the very small number of ex-military Mk11 Mod 0 rifles with a combat history that have been released to civilian collectors and buyers. The display was augmented by accessories and photos of the rifle in use in the field by elite US forces.
- 2nd Place Award: This award went to Ernie Lyles for another of his displays of unique and unusual forearms and technology. His display, *The Dardick Magazine-Fed Revolver*, focused on firearms technology that used triangular cartridges called "trounds" which were fed from a magazine into a cylinder and then revolved into place for firing. It also contained rare documentation related to the design, development and patenting of the gun and also included manuals and sales literature from the revolver's initial commercial release.
- Judges' Choice: The Judges Choice Award recognized Wayne Robinson and Wayne Miller for their comprehensive display of U.S. Military Jeeps of different eras and period appropriate gear, weapons, and uniforms. These two individuals have devoted significant energy and time to create a very detailed and historically accurate educational display.

Recognition and thanks to the Fall 2012 VGCA Gun Show Volunteers. Putting on the gun show is a lot of work. VGCA thanks and wishes to recognize those individuals whose efforts ensure an enjoyable, professional, and educational show experience.

I am letting my term on the board of directors expire and will not be running again. I would like to thank the VGCA for the last three years in Security, as it has been an important function for our gun shows, and has

- Dituary Gilbert Burnside "Gil" Hebard: For you longtime pistol shooters, I saw an obituary for Gil Hebard on the internet. Selected excerpts of a longer obituary follow. Gilbert "Gil" Hebard, 94, of Knoxville, TN died Sunday morning, Oct. 28, 2012, at his home. Mr. Hebard founded the nationally known Gil Hebard Guns in 1950. He was well-known in his industry for earning National Rifle Association competitive pistol marksmanship titles in the 1970s and 1980s. The champion shooter also authored a reference about competitive target shooting, "Pistol Shooters Treasury" in 1960. Gil Hebard Guns produced a popular and informative annual catalog from the 1950s until 2005.

Show & Tell for the October 25th Meeting: Show and Tell covered a variety of arms. Member 1 showed his new Walther LGV 10-meter air rifle that he found at the October 2012 Annual International Air Gun Show in Roanoke, VA. In the 1950's and 1960's these precision made airguns were state of the art in 10-meter international competition and are incredibly accurate. Member 2 displayed a Marlin Model 1894M lever action in .22 Magnum. These rifles, which are now collectible as only 12,000 were only made for 6-7 years in the 1980's, were based upon the Model 1894 center fire action with extensive modifications. Due to finicky feeding and ejection issues unless spotlessly clean, and a high cost, they were discontinued. Member 3 presented a nice Swedish 1894 Mauser cavalry carbine made by Carl Gustaf in Sweden. These rifles have rapidly increased in value in the past 10 years. While slightly modified for scope use by a prior owner, this one was two nice to pass up for the price. Member 4 exhibited a Yugoslavian-made AK-47 that was built on the heavier RPD receiver. These rifles are different from most basic AK's of the former East Bloc and had refinements like butt pads, heavier furniture and improved sights. These features and the quality construction ensure they are among the more accurate AK-type rifles.


