Mark I	Jan 1903 – Apr 1906	Long-slots bottom
Mark II	Apr 1906 –	Short-slots bottom w/3 ribs, nib on right side ends
Mark II*	– Feb 1916	Short-slots bottom w/3 ribs, no nib on right side ends
Mark III	Feb 1916 – Oct 1917	4 holes in bottom, 5 holes on sides
Mark IV	Post-Oct 1917	4 holes in bottom, 4 holes on sides
Mark IV +		4 holes in bottom, 3 holes & 1 oval on sides

+ NOTE: Designation switched to “Mark 4” at the end of WWII
