Presentation for the February 27, 2014 Meeting: The presenter of the evening was LTC. Shannon Zeigler, VGCA Member and our new Treasurer, his subject was on Arisaka Type-99 Short Rifle Inspection Marks. The Type-99 is a Mauser-Type bolt action with a five round integral magazine chambered in 7.7 x 58mm Japanese. One day Shannon plans to write a book on the Type-99 Short Rifle and was generous enough to share some of his knowledge with the club. To aid in his presentation Shannon brought with him an amazing PowerPoint presentation, as well as a few key examples of the variations of Type-99 Short Rifle which included the original Type-99 Short Rifle, the substitute Type-99 short rifle early (adopted around 1943), and "last ditch" substitutes.

The Japanese used a two piece buttstock to conserve wood and strengthen the stock. They used various species of wood including an Asian variant of walnut which is weaker than American black walnut. As the rifles entered the substitute phases the

dust cover along with any other non-essential parts were dropped in favor of speed in production and to conserve strategic material.

Approximately 2.5 million Type 99 Short Rifles were produced by nine manufacturers: four were government with supervisory responsibility over five sub-manufacturers. Each arsenal had its own inspection mark with the sub-manufacturers having the parent arsenals mark followed by their own. Shannon followed this by going into the symbolism of how a number of these arsenals came up with their inspection marks. You can use the inspection marks to identify a parts gun by seeing whether the different areas of the firearm came from the same arsenal. The key spots to look for matching inspection marks are the bottom of the stock near the trigger assembly, on the receiver right above the stock after the serial number, and on the dust cover if so equipped. Another inspection mark to look for is the second-class mark, which identifies previously rejected parts or parts of second rate quality deemed acceptable for use on late war production rifles. To learn more about Japanese Rifles come to Shannon's 2nd presentation in August.

Ammo was still at panic level prices, especially 22lr though there were definitely some deals to be had. The crowds were solid, and we had full aisles for most of the day, with near 2000 attendees over the weekend.

The evaluation table remained a staple separating us from the barrage of other guns shows. This year we added the ability to give attendees copies of the information about their guns and reference material for reading later. A special thanks goes out to **Addison Hurst** for continuing to head up this stellar service as well as a thanks to all those who help Addison out and provide relief for him and bring their knowledge to attendees throughout the show. **Larry Hare** provided an excellent service in giving up a lot of his time creating new membership badges. The club has moved forward transitioning to plastic membership badges that are easier to see and read.

As part of our continued effort to reach the community we ran a door prize this year for a Ruger 10-22 rifle and collected nearly 1000 email addresses for our new email notification list. Dennis' daughter Kate did a great job surveying people coming through the door on how they heard about the show. She then generated a report to help the club focus its advertising costs.

A special thanks goes to **Rick Nahas, Dennis Gerdovich, and Emory Hackman**. Thanks to their hard work we were at 91% table renewal at the end of the show. In fact, at this point there are only 7 tables left unsold for our Fall Show. It's been an outstanding job by our show committee and loyal vendors who keep coming back.

Display Awards: Chief Display Judge, **Jim Burgess** provided the following results of the judging of the Historical and Educational Displays at the Spring 2014 VGCA Gun Show:

1 st Place:	Hank Hagenau	Use 'em Up - Wear 'em Out, [French]

The Judges awarded a well-deserved **First Place** to **Henry P. Hagenau, Jr.** for another fascinating display on French Rifle and ammunition development. *Use 'em Up – Wear 'em Out: Cartridge Conversion Trials Rifles ... transitioning from the 8X50Rmm 'Lebel' to the 7.5x54 French,* included some very unique and rarely seen examples of trials rifles, experimental modifications, and cutaway examples to demonstrate the concepts and new rifle, which became the Mas 1936 to French military officials. It had an example of the rare French used Model 1886 Lebel with experimental modifications of 1927, that were used to perfect the new rimless 7.5X54 French

cartridge, which was then introduced for the new compact and accurate Mas 1936 bolt action rifle. That rifle was one of the last bolt action rifles adopted by a major power.

This display was outstanding and exhibited the great subject matter and clean design that was so ably demonstrated in one of Mr. Hagenau's previous displays of French arms, a chronology of training arms from the 1700's to the modern day that was titled **Boys to Men – French Military Trainers for Boys and Men**, which was displayed at our VGCA Show in March 2010 and covered in the April 2010 VGCA Newsletter. That display went on to take awards at the Ohio Gun Collectors Association meetings.

Second Place was awarded to Shannon Zeigler for his detailed display *Commonwealth Rifle Aperture Backsights.* This display was presented with six examples of target and accurized Enfield Rifles from the No.1MkIII and No.4MkI and II series that were made and or modified for target and precision shooting by Great Britain and Australia. The rifles were well displayed to highlight the rear aperture sights or "peep sights" as they are referred to in the US.

In addition to the rifles, Mr. Zeigler included a display of various sights that are found on this category of rifles. Included were Parker-Hale, A.G.Parker, BSA, Central (Australia) and Mues. He also had sight tools, gauges and adjusters, match sling swivels, sight covers, as well as match slings, shooting and scoring books, and manuals to illustrate how performance and progress was tracked in the shooting matches for which the rifles were designed.

These educational and historical displays are a key component of why we all collect and an integral part of the VGCA show (and other collectors associations shows), that differentiate us from the commercial shows. Both of these gentlemen did a lot of work and research and were honored by the judges. A Special thanks to both Jim and our others judges Joe Roberts and Richard Pripeton.
